This was closely followed by an incredibly successful coffee morning at the end of September, the proceeds of which (over £1300) went to Derian House.




Our pupils have embarked on a whole range of sporting activities and delighted in the completion of a new multi-use games area which has significantly added to our PE facilities.

History






The History department welcomed author and historian Michael Barrett, to Eden Boys' Preston, on Tuesday 11th and Wednesday 12th December, to give a series of lectures on his graphic novel 'Preston North End- The Rise of the Invincibles' to Year 8 students. The dramatic history of the birth of PNE FC and their unbeaten double winning team of 1888-89 tied in perfectly with the Autumn 2 History curriculum in which our boys investigated the Industrial Revolution in Britain. Michael helped students and Mr Clare understand the changes to the beautiful game that were introduced in the latter part of the 19th Century including tactics, equipment, professionalism and class division. He also gave us a fascinating insight into the research elements of the project and the method of production behind such gripping story, drenched in local tradition and sporting greatness.


Science

Science gets Arty!



Our very own artist in the making, our Science Technician Mrs Lorgat, has been very busy making sure that the laboratories are up to the highest standards that we expect. Mrs Lorgat has spent a great deal of time and energy in producing these extremely colourful, engaging and eye catching displays, which have helped transform the labs.







Mad About Science Club



During this term, we have focused on providing enriching opportunities for our Year 7 students. Our popular 'Mad about Science' club, having been previously open to a limited number of students, has opened its doors to all our Year 7 students who wish to attend. The Science Club revolves around engaging students in GCSE level practical work, enabling them to make links with the theory they learn. This half term we have focused on Chemistry; we have looked at group 1 elements and combustion in oxygen as well as their reactivity in water, acid and alkalis, and separation techniques such as chromatography, distillation and filtration. These topics have won so many student plaudits that we are now excited about offering something similar to our Year 8 students, in order to facilitate their transition to the GCSE content.

Science

At our open evening, the science department was jammed with budding new scientists at this year's open evening. With the help of the science staff and chosen students, every laboratory was host to some of the most exciting experiments and discoveries all evening that the Year 6 students couldn't wait to try.

The most popular of the evening was the demonstration of the methane bubbles. The Year 6 boys enjoyed watching the spectacular explosions produced from the soap bubbles containing a mixture of oxygen and methane. Messy but fun!

Afterwards, the boys used a pH indicator to create a chemical rainbow- a truly magical experience. Using the microscopes in the lab was a great opportunity for the Year 6 boys. They had the chance to get up close and personal with the cells in their body which, for many, was the first time they were able to do this.

Finally, they used the oscilloscope to analyse the waveform of electrical signals. One boy declared this was his favourite moment of the evening and all look forward to starting their science lessons here next September.


Each session began with a scene between a girl and a boy that was littered with myths and misconceptions about anger, violence and discrimination. Topics were covered such as derogatory language, laws and consequences, the idea of 'masculinity', self-defence and disclosing information.

The students were split into two teams and the actors performed the scene again, with the students freezing the action when they heard a myth. The forum leader then clarified all the facts and awarded points to both teams.

This was especially designed to explore facts in an active and fun way; breaking down barriers and giving the audience permission to be involved. All agreed it was a fabulous way to spend a rainy afternoon and again , huge thanks to Upfront Theatre Company!

Year 7



On a cold but sunny October day, Year 7 set off to spend the day undertaking some team building activities at Queens Park in Blackburn. Clutching the spare set of clothes they were asked to bring (and wondering why they were asked to bring it!) they piled onto the coach and off we went.

When we arrived, the boys were split up into separate groups, each undertaking a different task on a rota basis. This way the boys got a chance to meet new people and make new friends too. All the activities required co-operation and team work.


The boys showed great pride in representing Eden Boys School and they are looking forward to applying their skills to the UKMT Maths Challenge events which will take place early next year.

NCS Award








Art





Paper 1: 21st May 2019 Paper 2: 5th June 2019 Paper 3: 12th June 2019 During the 14th to 16th November, the year 11 GCSE Geography pupils were taken to Castle Head, in Cumbria, to complete their fieldwork research for Paper 3 of the GCSE exam (worth 30% of their overall grade).

For their Physical Geography fieldwork, we headed out to Aldingham beach, a shingle and pebble beach on the east coast of the Furness peninsula with views over Morecambe Bay, and backed by the small village of Aldingham. Whilst there, the task was to find out if the beach was being eroded by longshore drift, which gave the pupils opportunity to use specialist equipment to find the answer.

Can your child tell you what they discovered?

On the last day we headed out to Morecambe town centre, where the mission was to find out the public opinion on the urban regeneration in the town. Whilst conducting their surveys with the residents and visitors to the areas, the pupils were commented on as being polite and professional by those they spoke to making them excellent ambassadors for their school and community.

Overall the visit was a success and the pupils completed all the tasks to collect the data for their exams in the summer.

Top Tips

The UK economy is always in the news. whether that be Breakfast news or the late news. As a family, try to discuss news items and see the news content through the lens of a GCSE Geographer - "How might this news topic relate to my studies and the specification content?"

This will develop your AO3 (application skills) which are important exam skills.

Discuss the jobs that your family do why is the company located there? What sector does it belong to? Has technology changed the tasks over the years?

Safeguarding

The SHARP and CEOP systems (safeguarding information and reporting systems at Eden Boys' Preston) are in place. They can be located on the school website via the School Gateway. There are two links; one for **CEOP** and the other for **SHARP** System.

CEOP stands for **Child Exploitation and Online Protection**. It is the UK's national child protection agency (visit www.ceop.police.uk for more information). Through the Click CEOP advice and help centre, members of the public can access guidance on a broad range of topics to help protect their children, or alternatively report a concern directly to CEOP.

SHARP stands for School Help Advice Reporting System. There are many reasons why young people decide not to talk about incidents, whether that is due to not wanting to talk face to face, lack of confidence, scared, peer pressure or scared in case someone sees them talking to or seen in the school's office but to name just a few. The SHARP System allows young people to report any incidents which occur within the school and local community anonymously and without fear. Aside from the reporting tool SHARP delivers educational content to raise awareness on a wide range of subjects including: Bullying, Health, Community Issues, Weapons and Hate Crime.

The SHARP System and CEOP both promote inclusion, safeguarding, e-safety and provide additional opportunities for pupils to report their concerns.

Post-16 Options

Year 11 students have had lots of input from school staff and college staff regarding their post 16 opportunities. These are as follows:

What are my options after Year 11 (Post 16)?

Because of RPA (raising the participation age) legislation, you will have to do some sort of learning!

So, what are my options?

You may choose to:

- Stay at School, go to a College or Sixth Form and study full time courses
- Get a job and take a work related course alongside it such as an OCR National, BTEC, City and Guilds or other accredited course
- Be Self Employed but you will also need to do some accredited learning or training course
- Volunteer for 20 hours or more but will need to do some accredited learning alongside it, offered by the organisation or independent of it
- Do an Apprenticeship or other accredited training course

Year 11 students should be visiting colleges and attending open days which will allow them to make their choices for when they leave school. For more information regarding college applications, please speak to Mr Matadar at school.

Safety

We are becoming increasingly concerned about the unsafe driving and parking practices around the school site during drop-off and pick-up times, particularly at the side entrance to school on Witton Street. Can parents and guardians please ensure that they are observing the correct driving protocols to ensure the safety of our students, staff and the wider community by not causing obstruction or driving onto pedestrian walkways at the junction of Witton Street and New Hall Lane. It is recommended that you either use the designated drop-off at the front of school or drop students off on St Mary's Street and they can then use the pedestrian crossing. This will avoid causing obstruction to traffic by stopping on New Hall Lane. Thank you for your ongoing support with ensuring the safety of our school community.

Appointments

A reminder that parents are required to make all medical appointments outside of school hours.

If it is unavoidable, parents need to give prior notice by telephone so that the pupil's Head of Year can take them from class with the minimum disruption to learning time for themselves and other pupils.

There has recently been an increase in parents calling to collect pupils without providing the school with notice. Without prior notice, office staff may not always able to leave the office and locate your son for you. This may lead to pupils missing their appointments.

Please leave a message if you are unable to get through on the phone; our voice mail is monitored regularly. We will also require evidence of the appointment such as an appointment card or letter so that the absence can be authorised.


In preparation for their upcoming GCSE exam in Religious Studies, we organised a visit to Chester Cathedral, part of a heritage site of medieval architecture. What a fascinating place, originally founded as a Benedictine abbey in 1092. Now that is old!

Shortly after arriving, the boys were put into groups and given a guided tour of the magnificent church and its surroundings which cost £5000 a day to run! We followed the journey from the footsteps of the entrance of the Cathedral's font, where the boys learnt about the rite of Christian Baptism to a fascinating view of the Cathedral's Grand Organ containing nearly 5000 pipes! If that's not enough, then surely the wooden engravings in the nave choir seating is just as interesting. Carefully sculptured engravings in Gothic style with one of an elephant with feet of a horse! (Well, I think they had to take a wild guess what elephants' feet looked like, since there probably weren't any in Chester zoo to go off!)

Following this, the boys participated in a workshop where they had the opportunity to understand how long it takes to build Christian mosaics and try making their own. I think some of our boys even counted one mosaic which had a couple of thousand mini tiles. Well that must have taken a long time to put together with a lot of patience.

MCFC v Shakhtar Donetsk


